So this mid day meal facility came into being with the forethought and vision of the founder which is going on relentlessly even now. The context of practice:- The present management committee has been striving to fulfill the vision and missions of the founder. So the mid-day meal facility has been extended to our students realising its obsolute necessity. The practice:- The aspiring student enrol their names with the committee formed

for the purpose. The enrolled students list is submitted to the management. Then it takes the necessary measures to supply the meal. Everyday food is served in the centralised service hall in the nearby building. The mid-day meal committee supervises the entire process every day. Evidences of success :- The mid-day meals scheme has became a good success. The number of students availing

facility has been increases from year to year. The scheme has remarkable positive impact on the learning ability of our students. The success is evident from the fact that the absence of students in the afternoon classes is reduced to nil. Students would participate spiritedly in co-curricular, extracurricular and sports activities. It also enables the students to spend more time in the library after class hours. The mid-day meal scheme is very much appreciated by the NAAC pear teams, Affiliation committees of the university, visiting guests
